



VIDEO AUDITION INSTRUCTIONS FOR CAMPERS Matilda Jr. and Scrapped

- Prepare and memorize an audition song appropriate to your camp's show (Matilda Jr. or Scrapped). These audition songs are 30 second cuts from the show, and must be performed with the appropriate instrumental track. These tracks are available to view and download on our website.
- At the beginning of the audition video, slate (introduce yourself) with the following information:
 1. Name
 2. Age
 3. One interesting fact about yourself
 4. A brief description of any performance experience you may have, if applicable, and
 5. What song you are singing.
- In the same video, sing your prepared audition song, with the instrumental version of the selected audition soundtrack.
- Please take the video HORIZONTALLY.
- Upload your video on our website by **Wednesday, MAY 17th.**

For non singing roles

These are the audition monologues for Mr. and Mrs. Wormwood for Matilda Jr. Rising 6th - 9th graders can perform one of these monologues in addition to singing an audition song at auditions. We are looking for campers to make big vocal and physical acting choices.

MR WORMWOOD MONOLOGUE

In business, son, a man's hair is his greatest asset. Good hair means a good brain. (MR WORMWOOD takes the towel off of his hair and realizes his hair is green)

My hair...it's green! My hair! My lovely hair? I've got my deal today! The Russians...what am I going to do? This is all your fault! With your stupid books and your stupid reading! You're off to school in a few days and I know your headmistress Agatha Trunchbull. I've told her all about you. Scary woman she is, used to compete in the Olympics, throwing the hammer.
